Core values are fundamental beliefs that guide and direct what we do. Our <u>third</u> core value is, "We value <u>this body of Christ</u>, and so we will love one another and protect its purity"

Many professing Christians view "church" as a commodity they must shop around for. They evaluate a "church" based on what it will do for them; does it meet their needs; do the "worship" services "lead them into the presence of God;" what kind of programs are there for children, teenagers, singles, young marrieds, middle-agers, empty-nesters, senior citizens, widows, etc. etc. How sadly self-centered is this perspective!

A church is a *body* of believers. God gifts and equips each part of the body to minister to one another. Essential to this is loving one another and protecting its purity. A church that loves one another does so fervently, genuinely, and humble. It meets pressing needs, shares burdens and cares, patiently endures, ministers and serves one another, and forgives faults.

The church must also protect its purity, and this involves mutual discipline and watch-care. There must be loving, wise, gentle, and kind admonishment (Matt 18:15-17; Gal 6:1-2; Heb 3:13; 10:24-25) so that Satan cannot divide or take advantage of opportunities to spoil Christ's Bride.

Fundamental Christian Truth for Monday-Wednesday:

73) How does the church make disciples?

The church must proclaim the gospel to unbelievers, urging immediate repentance and faith. The church then baptizes and adds new believers to its membership and teaches them to obey the Word through worship, public and private instruction, exhortation, and discipline. Matt 28:19-20; Acts 2:41; 14:21-23; Col 3:16; 2 Thess 3:14 (Key terms: evangelism, baptism, church membership)

- → The "how" of making disciples is not left up to our ingenuity or imagination!
- → We learn how from Jesus' command (Matt 28:19-20), the church's practice under the direction of Jesus' disciples (Acts 2:41; 14:21-23), and his teaching through the disciples (Col 3:16; 2 Thess 3:14).
- → Central—essential—to making disciples is Christ's body, the church, specifically *local* or *individual* churches. Disciples will not be Christ's disciples (believing, obeying, and bearing fruit) apart from the local church.

Monday, October 11

Ecclesiastes 12—Youth should live life controlled by their Creator God and in light of life's fragility.

- The figures in verse 6 emphasize how fragile life is.
- How should you live life (vv. 13–14)? What does this look like?

Saturday, October 16

Song of Solomon 5—The bridge describes how she hates being separated (vv. 1-8) and describes her husband's appearance (vv. 9-16)

Would you describe someone you didn't know like this (vv. 10ff)? Why? What motivates these comparisons?

Friday, October 15

Song of Solomon 4—The bridegroom describes the beauty of the bride.

- In Bible times lovers would often call each other "brother" or "sister" (vv. 9-10, 12).
- Verse 12 describes how she has kept herself pure for her husband and him alone.
- It is clear that they love and enjoy each other—and that's how it should be, within the marriage bond (see also Prov 5:15-16; 9:17-18; 20:17).

Tuesday, October 12

Song of Solomon 1—Solomon and his bride express their love for one another.

- Throughout this book there are three different speakers, Solomon, his bride, and a chorus. You can tell who is speaking by *what* they say (for example, in 2:2 it is obvious who is talking) and the personal pronouns used (for example, the chorus usually has "we").
- How do poetic comparisons help describe human feelings?

- What does verse 16a tell and teach you about the exclusiveness of the marriage bond?

Fundamental Christian Truth for Thursday-Friday:

74) What is missions?

Missions refers to the church's efforts to make disciples, resulting in new churches. Matt 28:19-20; Acts 1:8; 14:21-23

- → Christ's church must think of "missions" as simply doing elsewhere what they are (or should be!) already doing at "home."
- This means taking the gospel to the lost who haven't heard it, baptizing and forming them into their own body of believers (local church), helping them mature through teaching and discipline, and having their own leadership.
- → The process of "missions" should be like a repeating cycle—what is done in one place is then repeated in other places, which then is repeated elsewhere.
- → If something is called "missions" that doesn't involve this process, it's not missions!

Thursday, October 14

Song of Solomon 3—The bride longs for her betrothed, and their wedding procession is described.

- What part of the bride is said to love Solomon (vv. 1-4)? Marital love involves one's entire person; it is not merely physical.
- What is the primary emotion on wedding days (v. 11)? Where is that emotion rooted?
